#### **VISITORS INFORMATION**

# Please note the below applies to visitors aged 10 and over, regardless of gender

COATS/ LONG CARDIGANS: Are not permitted on visits.

<u>HOODED CLOTHING</u>: Hoodies, or hoods on ANY clothing are NOT permitted.

<u>HATS</u>: Are not to be worn on visits- except for religious headwear. Headwear will be searched subject to HMP Birmingham searching policy.

ACCESSORIES: No visitor is permitted to wear Gloves, Scarves, Shawls or Ties.

SHOES: No knee length boots are permitted

<u>SKIRTS</u>: Must be at least Knee length when in the standing position, this is regardless of whether there are tights or leggings underneath

SHORTS: Must be knee length when in the standing position

<u>DRESSES</u>: MUST be knee length when in the standing position, MUST cover the breasts fully and appropriately including the cleavage and midriff area

<u>TOPS</u>: MUST cover the breasts fully and appropriately including the cleavage and midriff area, NO pockets are permitted on ANY top

TROUSERS: Trousers / jeans with RIPS are NOT permitted, combat style trousers with pockets down the legs are not permitted.

<u>SPORTS LOGOS</u>: Clothing displaying offensive patterns or logos are NOT permitted e.g – Cannabis logos, racist logos or offensive language.

Visitors wearing more than one pair of trousers of any kind will be refused entry. No play suits.

No Cargo trousers or Cargo shorts

Failure to comply with the above may result in you not gaining entry for your visit.


